

Moscow High School Counseling Center Update April 18, 2023

We have about **7 weeks until the last day of school** on June 7th, which means it's crunch time for students to accomplish their goals, such as graduating with their class, maintaining or achieving a certain GPA, or being eligible for next year's athletics and activities. Along with classroom teachers, we will continue being in contact with students and families who need extra support to succeed over the next few weeks. Seniors who have all of their requirements met will be able to participate in the **Graduation Ceremony on June 9th**. Any senior taking an online class will want to have those finished sooner, however, so that we'll be able to save their spot when we create the walk list at the end of May. If a senior does not have their requirements met in time for the Graduation Ceremony, they will not walk, but once they finish up, they can still receive their diploma when the time comes.

Any MHS student who needs to **retake a failed class** this summer can do so online through Idaho Digital Learning Alliance. Students can choose between the "cohort" courses which roll out content on a week-by-week basis between June 12 - August 18 or the "flex" courses which are self-paced with a window of May 30 - August 18. Most students work on no more than one or two classes during the summer. The courses cost \$75 each. 



The **junior class took the SAT at MHS** on April 12, 2023 as part of their graduation requirements. Students should be able to <u>view their scores</u> on May 3rd. In terms of the SAT, over 1,800 universities are now <u>test-optional</u>, but a good score can still help admission chances and improve one's course placement for English and Math. Students who wish to take the SAT again or to take the ACT can do so by registering for one of the national test dates (see below). The <u>ACT</u> is the other nationally recognized exam accepted by all colleges and universities. Between the SAT and ACT, many students do better on one than the other, and we can help students learn the differences. The cost of the first time taking the ACT can be reimbursed for Idaho students through Advanced Opportunities.

Question from an MHS student: How many Dual Credit / AP courses should I take?

Answer: Our Dual Credit students take an average of about 1.5 Dual Credit courses per semester, and it's rare for a student to take four or more. Keep in mind that five is standard for a full-time college student, and our Dual Credit students have other high school courses to take along with several other responsibilities that come with being a high school student.

In terms of the college-level Advanced Placement (AP) courses, there is no maximum. An MHS student could hypothetically take five AP courses per semester and another four online, but this is not recommended. Most AP courses expect a student to spend at least one hour of studying and homework for each class meeting, so a student taking nine AP classes would be spending at least 70-90 hours of their 112 waking hours completely dedicated to their AP classes.

So how many should you take? If you are a junior looking at competitive colleges, that number may be 3-4. If you are a sophomore with the same aspirations, it's probably 2-3. If you are a senior looking at less competitive schools, then maybe it's 1-2. But the best number for you will depend on your personal goals and the time you want to commit to activities, work, family, and the community.
